**ORDER ON REQUEST TO OMIT FROM THE
NOTICE THE TEXT OF PROPOSED RULES,
PURSUANT TO MINN. STAT. § 14.14,
SUBD. 1(B)**

This matter came before Chief Administrative Law Judge Tammy L. Pust on September 26, 2018. The Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (Department) seeks an order authorizing the omission of the proposed rule text when it publishes its notices of possible revisions to the Minnesota State Building Code for each of the proposed rule chapters referenced above. The Department asserts that the expense of printing the proposed rules in the *State Register* is unduly burdensome, and a poor use of limited state resources, given the narrow class of persons affected by the rule proposals.

As an alternative to publication, the Department pledges to circulate notice of the rulemakings to approximately 1,500 stakeholders, to post electronic copies of the proposed rules on the Department's website, and to provide a free copy of the entire rule text upon request. Further, the Department's notices will detail the subject matter of the omitted rule text, cite the statutory authority for the proposed rules, and outline the proposed rules' purpose and motivation.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Conditioned upon the Department's use of the procedures outlined in its petition of September 26, 2018, the request to omit the proposed rule text is **GRANTED**.
