1 176.101 COMPENSATION SCHEDULE. 2 Subdivision 1.Temporary total disability. 3 (a) For injury producing temporary total disability, the compensation is 66-2/3 percent of the weekly 4 wage at the time of injury. 5 6 (b)(1) Commencing on October 1, 2013, and each October 1 thereafter, the maximum weekly 7 compensation payable is 102 percent of the statewide average weekly wage for the period ending 8 December 31 of the preceding year. 9 10 (2) The Workers' Compensation Advisory Council may consider adjustment increases and make 11 recommendations to the legislature. 12 13 (c) The minimum weekly compensation payable is \$130 per week or the injured employee's actual 14 weekly wage, whichever is less. Permanent partial disability 24 (a) Compensation for permanent partial disability is as provided in this subdivision. Permanent partial 25 disability must be rated as a percentage of the whole body in accordance with rules adopted by the 26 commissioner under section 176.105. For injuries occurring on or after October 1, 2021, the dollar 27 amounts for the corresponding permanent partial disability ratings in the table in section 176.101, 28 subdivision 2a, shall be increased by [X] percent over the dollar amounts in effect on September 30, 29 2021. For injuries occurring on or after October 1, 2022 and each subsequent October 1, the dollar 30 amount for each corresponding rating shall be increased by the same percent increase in the statewide 31 average weekly wage most recently computed under Minnesota Statures 176.645 without the annual

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cap provided by that section. If there is no increase, or if there is a decrease, in the statewide average
weekly wage, the dollar amounts shall not change for that year. The commissioner shall publish each
updated table on the DLI website annually by October 1. The percentage determined pursuant to the
rules under section 176.105 must be multiplied by the corresponding amount in the following table as
adjusted according to paragraph (a):
